Thirty - six scholarships have been made available to students in the high schools and junior colleges of California and the western states. Through these awards, the Board of Trustees of the California College of Arts and Crafts wishes to encourage students who are seeking a career in some area of creative art by recognizing ability, and by granting them financial assistance.

Each of the 36 scholarships has a value of \$100. Winners will receive one-half of the scholarship during the first term of study at CCAC, and the other half during the second term.

20 Scholarships for High School Students

There are 12 scholarships available for high for the Fall term (September 15, 1952); 8 scholarships are available for high school graduates (primarily those who graduate in

January, 1953) who plan to enter CCAC for for the Spring term (February 16, 1953).

16 Scholarships for Junior College Students

There are 12 scholarships available to junior college students who wish to transfer to CCAC for the Fall term (September 15, 1952), and four for those who wish to enter the Spring term (February 16, 1953).

Scholarships are applied toward the tuition charges for any of the curricula selected by the student-winners. A general catalog of the College will be mailed to each entrant, and he is advised to read it carefully.

Students who wish to develop their talents in creative art may enroll for the Summer Session, which begins on July 1, 1952, and continues for six weeks; a special Summer Session Bulletin is available upon request. The Fall semester begins September 15, 1952; the Spring semester on February 16, 1953.

college curricula

The College offers four degrees. The degree of Bachelor of Applied Arts is granted to students who complete the Commercial and Industrial Art curriculum, including two years of specialized work under outstanding artists. The curriculum leading to the degree of Bachelor of Art Education prepares students for positions as teachers of arts and crafts in Junior and Senior High Schools and Junior Colleges. The School of Fine Arts offers courses intended primarily for students who wish to specialize in mural painting, easel painting, sculpture or in any other medium of his choice

and leads to the degree of Bachelor of Fine Arts. Qualified graduates may work toward a Master of Fine Arts degree. Other students, desiring to concentrate on the professional art courses exclusively, rather than take the additional general education subjects required of all degree candidates, may work for three or four year certificates of completion in the School of Applied Arts or the School of Fine Arts. The California College of Arts and Crafts is a non-profit institution which uniquely combines collegiate level instruction in all various specialized fields of the creative arts with the diversified objectives of the liberal arts.

1. EXACTLY SIX examples of original work must constitute the contents of the portfolio desired from each contestant. Candidates for scholarships in Fine Arts, Advertising Art, or other areas wherein the submitting of flat work is possible, should include TWO original drawings, one painting (any medium), and three other examples. Work should be matted, but not framed, and should have a maximum size of 22 x 28 inches.

Examples of work in Crafts should not exceed SIX in number, or more than twenty-five pounds in weight, if originals are to be delivered to the Scholarship Committee.

Photographs of originals may be submitted.

Each piece of work should carry the student's name and return address. Portfolios and examples may be delivered in person to the general office, Treadwell Hall, marked "Attention, Scholarship Committee," or may be shipped via Railway Express, prepaid, to:

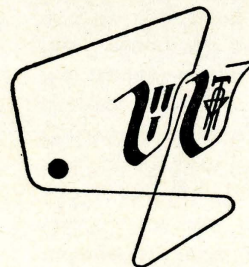
Notice to Students Competing for Fall Semester, 1952 Scholarships: Portfolios of work must be in the hands of the Scholarship Committee by May 17, 1952. Winners will be notified of the results through their high school principals, junior college deans, or art instructors by June 1 1952.

Notice to Students Competing for Spring Semester, 1953 Scholarships: Portfolios of work must be in the hands of the Scholarship Committee by December 13, 1952; winners will be notified by January 1, 1953. The College will arrange for the return of all work submitted, but reserves the right to retain work for a period of three months for exhibition purposes. The College, however, cannot be responsible for the damage or loss of any work, although personnel will exercise every care in handling the work of entrants.

2. Your entry blank should be accompanied by a personal letter, giving your reasons for desiring a career in creative art. Two letters of recommendation, one from an art instructor, and a second from your high school principal or junior college dean should accompany your entry form. Finally, the principal of your school or registrar of your college should be requested to forward a transcript of your scholastic record to the Scholarship Committee.
