In today's world, gender is an explosive topic. Anita Hill brought sexual harassment to national attention, but this is only one aspect of our lives as gendered people. In the art world, gender is a subject of intense investigation and artmaking. The issue exists not only on a public or professional level, but has personal meaning in each of our lives.

The Gender Forum will take place during the week of February 8-12. Four lunch hour programs are planned for Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 11 to 12. Other lectures and presentations have been scheduled throughout the week including a lecture by special guest performance artist, Barbara Smith on her current project with partner, Dr. Roy Walfrod, a member of Biosphere II.

On Wednesday, February 10, internationally noted writers Susan Griffin and Sam Keen will each address the topic of war and peace set against the continual struggles played out in our personal lives. This memorable event will take place in Nahl Hall at 7:00 p.m.

Susan Griffin is a well-known and respected feminist writer, poet, essayist, lecturer, teacher, playwright and filmmaker. She is the author of more than twenty books - including Women and Nature: The Roaring Inside Her; Pornography and Silence: Culture's Revenge Against Nature; and Chorus of Stones: The Private Life of War.

Sam Keen has been featured on a special Bill Moyers PBS Interview, and his book Faces of the Enemy, was also a PBS documentry nominated for an Emmy Award. His other books include To A Dancing God; The Passionate Life; Loving Combat; and Fire in the Belly: On Being a Man.
