



A wooded hillside campus in metropolitan Oakland is the setting for the California College of Arts and Crafts, one of the most complete art training centers in the nation today. Its programs in fine arts, crafts, design, art education and the humanities lead to Bachelors' and Masters' Degrees. Founded in 1907, the College has developed a philosophy of education which combines academic studies with art theory as well as training in art skills, preparing students for both the esthetic and the practical aspects of their life work. CCAC graduates are active in professional art fields throughout the United States and in many other nations.

Summer Session each year offers a broad program of study, both for professional artists and teachers and for beginners. During the fall and spring semesters, anyone wishing to take a limited program may attend Evening College, Saturday classes or the regular day classes. On Saturday mornings, children and teen-age students meet in special courses.

Visitors are welcome to view showings of student work and other special exhibits in the Library-Exhibition Center and, except during class hours, in the auditorium of Guild Hall. Individuals and groups wishing to visit classrooms and studios should make arrangements with the Reception Office, Treadwell Hall.
