#### **ART FOR CHILDREN AGES 6 TO 8**

DIXIE LAWS

An opportunity for children to express their ideas through materials and techniques appropriate to their age group; discussions, demonstrations, and individual instruction to expand the children's esthetic experience.

#### **ART FOR CHILDREN AGES 9 TO 11**

A definite progression of lessons teaches students the fundamentals of both drawing and painting as well as 2 and 3 dimensional crafts. Demonstrations are given showing the use of the tools and media; creativity is encouraged by allowing students to explore many possibilities. Students are encouraged to evaluate their works in group critiques as well as individual instruction.

#### **EARLY TEEN-AGE ARTS AND CRAFTS**

JOHN WARNER

For ages 12 to 14, this course maintains a balance between 2 and 3 dimensional projects so that students can find creative expression in advanced methods of printing, sculpture, drawing, watercolor and oil painting. Films and field trips are provided to strengthen and broaden visual perception. An awareness of art movements and well-known artists gives the students greater insight into their own work.

#### **\*DRAWING FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS**

RICHARD GAYTON

Introduction to drawing, employing traditional and experimental media and techniques with stress upon the basic ideas common to all attitudes in drawing. Mr. Gayton studied at the California College of Arts and Crafts and privately under distinguished California artists. A young artist, his drawings and paintings have been exhibited throughout California and are to be found in numerous collections.

#### **\*PAINTING FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS**

MARY SNOWDEN

Oil and watercolor, working from still life or landscape. Mary Snowden received her B.A. at Brown University and her M.A. at the University of California. Her paintings have been widely exhibited.

	Saturday Classes meet from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.
<b>Sept. 7</b>	Registration 9 a.m. Six to 14 year olds register in the studios in which the classes are scheduled. High School students register in Guild Auditorium. Classes will be filled in order of enrollment and begin immediately after registration.
<b>Nov. 30</b>	No classes. Thanksgiving weekend.
<b>Dec. 14</b>	Last day of Saturday Classes.

**TUITION:** Courses for students aged 6-14, \$29.00. Courses for High School students \$45.00. Payable at registration. This includes materials in the Early Teen-Age Arts and Crafts and the Art for Children classes. Students must supply their own materials in the Drawing and Painting classes.

\*These drawing and painting classes are part of the regular College curriculum (Drawing S21, Painting S23), which high school students may attend, but not for credit. For regular students and adults, these classes may carry 1 unit of credit.

**BERTHA ALEXANDER SCHOLARSHIPS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE:** Six half-tuition scholarships for Fall and Spring Saturday Classes. These scholarships are available to elementary and junior high school students and are awarded on the basis of demonstrated ability and financial need.
