An evening of adventure is planned for **Friday**. Everyone will be taken on a scenic bus ride to the Exploratorium. "This first of its kind " museum has been widely copied world wide, but never equalled. The brainchild of Robert Oppenheimer is an open plan physics lab of over 150 hands-on exhibits. The museum is located in the Palace of Fine Arts designed by Bernard Maybeck for the 1915 Panama Pacific exhibition.

A shuttle will run from the Exploratorium through the city and offer a choice of drop off points.

Students can then explore a part of the city, and return back to the hotel at their leisure.

The Beaux Arts Ball will be held in the historic Warfield theater on **Saturday** evening. The Warfield a 1920's theater has been modified for dancing and concerts and the stage will be filled with another fantastic live band.

San Francisco can be reached by two international airports: San Francisco International (SFO) and Oakland International (OAK). Each has convenient connections to the hotel. Intercity travel is easy.

We have high speed rail ( BART ), complimented by street cars, cable cars, buses, and taxis. A

shuttle from SFO to the hotel is \$5. BART from Oakland International to the hotel is about \$3.

Continental Airlines will provide round trip airfares from \$150-\$350 depending on city of origin. Students planning to attend should budget approximately \$375 for registration fees, 5 nights at the hotel, meals, local transportation and spending money.

The symposium will be held at the John Portman designed Hyatt Regency, San Francisco. The rates are: Single/Double \$89.00 - Triple/Quad \$95.00.
